Fr Joe's Reflection Love, Desire and Relationships

Jesus preaches about forgiveness and is accused of sitting with sinner, drunkards and tax collectors. Yet even Jesus seemingly draws a limit on God's forgiveness: To blaspheme against the Holy Spirit cannot be forgiven. What does he mean?

To sin against the Holy Spirit is to believe that we are too sinful for God to forgive us. The barrier in accepting God's love is often ourselves. God's ultimate desire is for us to realise that we were made in love, are loved and called to love in return.

Sin is very real in our world. It is the breaking of our relationship with God and the rejection of divine love. The story of the Fall in the Bible points to the tendency of human beings to place ourselves at the centre of the universe, rather than God. This stance not only breaks our relationship with the God but also with our neighbour and all of creation.

Humanity was built to receive the infinite love of God. In rejecting love, we are left empty and we try to fill our lives with power, wealth or self-indulgence. We make false idols of ourselves and the material world. Pride blinds us. Accepting love is the only desire that will remove the emptiness.

Even in the story of the Fall, God proclaims the fundamental goodness of humanity in what is called the "Protoevangelium." God tells the Serpent in Genesis that, even though humanity has fallen from the grace of heaven, human beings will still seek to oppose and fight evil. While the Serpent may have seemingly won this battle for humanity's soul, evil has had not triumphed. Humanity was made fundamentally good! People fundamentally desire what is good, they are just unsure what it is! They seek it in the wrong places.

Jesus, true God and true Man, is the fulfilment of creation. Unlike Adam and Eve, he freely accepts the Father's love and humbles himself to follow the Father's will. He has no need to seek fulfilment in power or wealth for himself but acts so that others may experience the Father's love.

Jesus distractors accuse him of being in league with Beelzabub; with evil. These same distractors could not believe that Jesus could forgive sin. But by forgiving sin, removing shame and guilt. Jesus helps people see that they are loved by the Father. Jesus binds up and removes the power of the Evil One (the Strong Man) to tempt people away from God. Released from the bonds of evil people become free to restore their relationship with God. Jesus' invitation is for us to enter into the family of God. Our desires in life needs to be more than self-advancement and self-protection, we need to seek out the common good. We need to desire what God desires. This is the divine and sacrificial love that Jesus demonstrates on the Cross and the love that we are invited into. To love as God loves. Jesus sits with sinners, drunkards, tax collectors and us because he wants to give people an opportunity to experience love. He is not worried about his reputation or social standing but solely about leading people to the Father. He is binding up the Strong Man and is taking back what is rightfully God's. and we follow in His footsteps towards the promised Kingdom of God.

Fr Joe on Mission Immersion to Timor Leste (15-30 June)

Fr Joe will be accompanying a mission immersion trip of students from St Laurence College and Padua College to Timor Leste. St Laurence College supports the Edmund Rice Foundation which has helped poor farmers form cooperatives to grow, process and package vanilla bean products. Padua College has annually raised money for the St Francis of Assisi College in Fatucahi in the Manufahi district for 18 years. The Australia Franciscan Friars help support the growing Franciscan presence in Timor Leste.

The students will be visiting several mission areas that their Colleges have helped support to get to know the people of one of our country's nearest neighbours. Timor Leste has a very young population (median age 20 years) and it is both the most Catholic (95%) and poorest country in Asia.

While Fr Joe is away his Franciscan brothers, Fr John and Fr Joseph from Kedron will be helping with most weekend mass. Fr Alberto, a visiting Carmelite Friar stationed in Perth will also say mass. Alberto has family in Stafford.
