Fr Joe's Reflection Sickness, Death and God's healing touch

In Australia we live in a culture of endless youth, where illness, aging and death are almost hidden from public view. Australia had one of the highest life expectancy in the world. The main causes of death are heart attack and dementia. Almost half of deaths under 75 years were potentially avoidable.

In Australia we have a very mobile culture and family are often moved for work. With smaller families it has become difficult to care for our sick and aged relatives in our homes. It not uncommon for frail relatives to be moved to care or a nursing home. There is now a real separation of young people from the realities of aging.

If you go to visit our Asian and Pacific Islander neighbours you cannot avoid seeing aging and death. Several generations of a family often live under one roof and the young know the struggle of the aged relatives. When death occurs the family will often bring the body of the deceased into their homes or the Church for several days to pray around the body. Neighbours and friends will share stories about the deceased to comfort each other.

There is a growing trend in Australia to rush to have the funeral of a loved one. This often leaves little time for family and friends to truly mourn and come to terms with the reality of our common mortality. We avoid the reality of death. We avoid the sick and the dying.

The Church has many sacraments and rituals around illness, dying and death. These remind us that our Saviour came, saw and shared with us the experience of suffering and death. These sacraments help us to see more clearly the reality of life. They encour-

age us to see the importance of relationships in our lives. They help us see God's mercy and the healing presence of God even in the most difficult of struggles.

The miracles in today's Gospel involved touch. The haemorrhaging women reached out and found healing by touching Jesus' cloak. Jesus gave life back to the little girl by taking her hand. It is through kind words and close contact that healing happens today. It is in relationship that we truly live.

The reality of sickness and death entered the world through sin but eternal life is restored in relationships and journeying through life together. Our Saviour came and experienced the highs and lows, the joys and struggles of our human existence, to show us the way to eternal life.

In this earthly realm we experience the limitation of life and we are reminded that every moment of life is precious. When we know this we can truly appreciate the Resurrection and eternal life. We are in preparation for living our immortal life in the love of God.



EVERYTHING IS CONNECTED

Mark tells fascinating stories of women this week: the healing of the woman suffering from hemorrhages and Jairus' daughter being given life anew. Both depict Jesus reintegrating the marginalized into a new family of God. We have images of crossing boundaries, cultural (closeness to women) and natural (the Sea of Galilee) in the midst of storms and the human production and operation of boats. We may well think of the boats of fishing and of war, old and new. As Mark recently in the Sunday readings, portrayed God (in Jesus the Christ) as Gardener and as seafarer again here; even as

creative head-caterer, the meaning of the Markan parables is all about this broad, inclusive 'Kindom' of God -of gathering all into the Family of God. The Godhead planting seeds, calming seas, healing women, cooking breakfast, multiplying bread and fish, going to the margins, all should give us breath and hope. Laudato Si' is addressed to all people of good will. Strengthening goodness and will, body and soul is what we need for healing earth (See the eBook Healing Earth) and waging peace (See Pax Christi and the Society of Friends – The Quakers).





News from Fr Joe on Friday, 21st June

Hi

In Dili, myself and students from Padua College and St Laurence College stayed with the Canossian Sisters in Belida. We visited sites associated with Timor Leste Independence including Cheda, the human rights museum, and the Santa Cruz Cemetery. We visited a trade school in a very poor area of Dili.

We went up into the hills above Dili to villages supported by the Mary MacKillop Centre and Edmund Rice Foundation. The villages have developed a cooperatives selling coffee, vanilla bean and a small kiosk.

I am currently in Bacau and we have visited a school supported by the Salesians in Australia, a trade school for women run by the Canossians, and the Marist Teachers College.

The best thing I shave seen is how the Australia religious organisations have acted to empower the local communities. Most of the charitable foundations are now staffed by the Timor Leste people. The community projects are now starting to be self-sustaining and moving to help new areas. The Marist Brothers doing a great work running a teacher college. Adios.
