# Fr Joe's Reflection

Power in Weakness. Prophetic witness.

The Catholic Church in Australia has created influential and powerful institutions in education, health and social services. However they can easily become like the ancient kingdoms of Judea and Israel if they pay only passing attention to the Word of the Lord. These Kingdoms lost the presence of God when service in the Temple was neglected, idols worshipped and God's justice and mercy ignored. They collapsed and the people sent into the Babylonian exile to regain their sense of being God's people.

Our worship today cannot become only external rituals nor can our institutions divorce themselves from prayer and the worshipping community. The Church today needs to regain a sense of being prophetic witness to the Word of God.

Jesus in the Bible is often seen as coming from a position of weakness and is ignored and misunderstood by those around him. In his home town of Nazareth he was still seen as the carpenter's son. They thought they knew him all too well. Similarly Jesus embraces powerlessness when he takes up the Cross in the Passion.

The ancient Prophets bridged the gap between ritual and the heart. They often stood outside the power structure of the civil or religious authority. In their weakness they were sensitive to the needs of the poor and the marginalised. In their weakness they experienced the misuse of power by the powerful. They took time to listen to God in prayer. They fearlessly proclaimed the Word of God and were often persecuted or isolated because of their actions. They aimed to educate and change hearts by their words and symbolic actions. They placed God and God's ways at their centre of their life.

People do not like to be told that they are wrong or have the light of truth shined on their actions. This is true in our time as it was in the time of the prophets. Evil and injustice cannot be silently ignored. Often the prophets pointed out to the people the conse-

quences of injustice and faithlessness to their community. When the Church speaks up against immorality, economic injustice or on behalf of our First Nation People or Refugees and Migrants it is not always loved! When it preaches the sacredness of all life, it is often denounced. Yet it cannot be silent just to be popular. That was the sin of the ancient kings of Judea and Israel as they made compromises to the surrounding pagan powers.


Today the Church in Australia is challenged to be prophetic. It no longer holds political or social power in society and often not even over nominally Catholic institutions. What it does have is a community which desires to bring alive the Word of God and from this community comes the prophetic voices calling for God's justice, mercy and compassion. There are many things in our world that should be celebrated and praised but prophets also seek to shine light on the darkness which we tolerate or ignore. They seek to expose what opposes God's Word.

'Urapun Muy', from the Kalaw Kawaw Ya dialect of the Top Western Islands of the Torres Strait, means 'One Fire'. The title of this work pays homage to

Torres Strait Islanders and Aboriginal people everywhere, as we all have that one fire: our passion for our culture. In this work, I have depicted the hands of our ancestors that have carefully dropped a burning ember on to a fire. This ember burns hot with intensity, stoking the flames, as it combines with the new fire. The linear detail shows the energy and power as cultural knowledge is transferred from our ancestors to us today. Culture is the fire that gives us knowledge, wisdom and purpose.

It is our responsibility to maintain, practice, and pass on our fire to our future generations.

Afterall, Culture keeps us Blak, Loud and Proud.

## EVERYTHING IS CONNECTED by Rick Dalmau

Mark, whose name comes from a blacksmith's hammer, is the only gospel writer to call Jesus a carpenter. We know Middle Eastern buildings were and still are largely masonry ones with only openings involving timber lintels and posts and doors. It has been guessed that Joseph and Jesus were involved in carpentry needed in the town of Sepphoris very near Nazareth. When we consider Laudato Si', that is "Praise be..." to all Creation as the words of St Francis' Canticle of Creation, we also know St Francis was instructed to "rebuild my church". At first taking a literal construction message from this divine appearance, St Francis eventually gets that it is metaphorical. We too are charged by Laudato Si' and Laudate Deum with rebuilding our whole approach to our place in Creation (and the church) and 'getting' the message that we are co-creators and deeply involved in an integral ecology of humans, trees, animals, stones, air, water, fire. We have models of how to have an ecological approach from indigenous peoples everywhere


